NATIONAL CENTRE FOR EXCELLENCE IN THE TEACHING OF MATHEMATICS check out the new section of NCETM website with comprehensive updates on maths qualifications

A new section of the NCETM website has been launched, providing a one-stop-shop source of up-to-the minute information on all aspects of maths qualifications and curriculum. The section, which is

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updated as and when new information is released, reflects changes in policy and practical arrangements linked to GCSE, A Level, Core Maths and several more areas. Information comes from Government organisations, exam boards, subject associations, the NCETM, and other bodies.

The section is designed principally to be of use to secondary schools heads of maths departments, but all teachers of mathematics will, on occasion, find information relevant to their role. They'll be tweeting about these updates from dedicated Twitter account, @NCETMQandC.

Mastery Moments: new videos from the NCETM Newly published the first of a series of short videos called Mastery Moments, each of which tries to encapsulate one aspect of teaching for mastery in a couple of minutes. The first one, 'Answers in complete sentences', explains why it's a good idea to get pupils to answer questions in maths lessons using complete sentences.



What's it all about?



Research shows that children who enjoy writing very much are seven times more likely to write above the level expected for their age compared with children and young people who do not enjoy writing at all. Similarly, children and young people who write outside school daily are five times more likely to be writing above the expected level for their age compared with young people who never write outside school^[1]. We also know that tapping into children's interests is a great way of engaging them in learning.

With this in mind, and following on from a hugely successful competition in 2013, they have again teamed up with Routledge and their popular *Descriptosaurus* series to provide teachers with a platform to promote writing for enjoyment, purpose and audience. By giving pupils the chance to write about a time period that appeals to them, coupled with inspiration from the *Descriptosaurus* books, they aim to unlock their passion for writing.

Thrive (led by St Richard's Catholic College) TSA is pleased to offer a part-time MA through the University of Brighton, delivered principally in twilight

sessions at venues local to the Rother area.

The programme is divided over two years, with an accreditation option for teachers holding M-level credits from their PGCE. The proposed two routes will be:

With credits:

- One x 40 credit 'Professional enquiry' module normally delivered over a 3-6 month period
- One x 20 credit module leading to a research proposal for the dissertation
- The dissertation (60 credits) normally over one calendar year

Without credits:

- One x 20 credit module providing support for postgraduate study through engagement with a current research in relation to an individually identified area of interest
- One x 40 credit module to be negotiated*
- One x 40 credit 'Professional enquiry' module normally delivered over a 3-6 month period but this could be reviewed
- One x 20 credit module leading to a research proposal for the dissertation
- The dissertation (60 credits) normally over one calendar year

Starting in May 2017, the MA is rooted in school-based practice, making it an excellent choice for teachers who are reflecting on and developing their practice and initiatives across their school or college.

The aim is that the programme provides a series of structured activities to support the process of enquiry, from smaller and quickly implemented projects to deeper and fuller investigation. This process of enquiry - from identification of a question worthy of exploration via a systematically planned and evaluated intervention/investigation facilitates the practitioner's insight into a professional issue. These may be focused on the same or different issues but are normally linked to the School Improvement Plan.



By locating the programme in local venues, using online access and employing twilight time the costs of the MA have been kept as low as possible.

Dependent on cohort size the maximum cost will be approximately £1750 per annum, and the minimum will be approximately £1300 per annum. With average UK fees for M-level courses currently estimated at £3000 per annum, this programme represents substantial value for money.
