Dear Parents/Carers

I do hope you and your family are all well and settling back in to routines following the half-term holiday. We now enter the ninth week of remote learning (12th week of lockdown) so hopefully the pupils, particularly in Years 7-9 have realised that this is the 'new normal' for the remaining six and a half weeks of term six. Form Tutors will be organising Google Meets with members of their form this term so that pupils have an opportunity to feed back on their remote learning experience and raise any issues. A number of staff are also now using audio in their lesson slides to help with engagement.

As parents/carers, please continue to encourage your son/daughter with his/her learning getting them to make use of the resources on BBC Bitesize, Oak National Academy and Seneca, to name but three of the many online sites available to support home learning. Pupils completing work early each day should either focus on a Passion Project or make use of the 'Isolation' Booklet [here](#) to explore something new. Developing a hobby, baking, gardening or undertaking the Sussex Challenge activities are a good way to take time away from the computer. There are also the departmental quests that you can encourage your child to participate in or the daily challenge sent out by Mrs Wood. Several of these activities will result in vouchers for the most interesting and engaging activities Your child should know how to access these but if they are struggling, do get in touch with the Form Tutor.

From June 15th we are able to welcome Year 10 pupils back in small groups. The staff are all looking forward to seeing them again. Parents of Year 10 pupils will be sent a letter and a timetable mid-week so that you can decide how your son/daughter will travel to school on the days allocated to him/her. Please be aware that we are only able to have 25% of the pupils back at a time (a quarter of the year group) so your son/daughter will only attend up to twice a week. I know this will disappoint many parents and pupils but unfortunately we are tied by [DfE restrictions](#) and to break these restrictions might invalidate our Risk Assessment as well as compromise the health and safety of all in the school. A short video will be sent to the pupils explaining how the new arrangements will work so I hope you will watch it too.

Children of Key Workers, vulnerable pupils and pupils with an EHCP will still be expected to attend school between 9.00am and 3.00pm daily. They will be placed in a separate Block to Year 10 pupils and will have different break and lunch times to ensure social distancing can be maintained and the risk of any contamination minimised. Your son/daughter will bring home further information towards the end of the week.

Many parents/carers have indicated that they are frustrated with the current arrangements and just want to see their son/daughter returning to school. Rest assured that this is the feeling of the staff and I too. However, the health and safety of all has to be paramount and therefore we must adhere to Government guidance to prevent the spread of Coronavirus. On this subject, can I ask you to monitor the whereabouts of your children on sunny days as we have been made aware



that some pupils are not practising social distancing on the seafront or in parks and are therefore putting themselves and others at risk. My sincere hope is that every pupil can return in the autumn unscathed by this dreadful pandemic! For those families where there has been a bereavement or a hospitalisation for a period of time then our pastoral team will do all they can to support your son/daughter. Please keep the school staff informed of any issues.
