### 1. Welcome and Introductions

- Miss Cronin introduced herself to the group and asked each parent/carer to introduce themselves and confirm which year group/s their child/ren are in.
- Miss Cronin explained that the purpose of PFG meetings was to discuss things going on in school life. Throughout the year, various staff members will come in to PFG meetings to introduce topics/trends in their subjects i.e. Maths, English, Music. Mrs Bligh (Assistant Head & Designated Safeguarding Lead) or Ms Vanvuchelen (PSHEe Co-ordinator) will come and talk about PSHEe, Pastoral Care needs and wellbeing. PFG is also used as a platform to gauge parent opinion for new ideas i.e. if the school is looking at introducing a new report/reporting system PFG will be asked for their opinions and feedback. PFG will also be asked to voice WWW (What we do well) and EBI (Even better if) What is going well / what changes and improvements we can make to improve school life for the better.

### 2. Teaching & Learning Tour for morning group parents/carers

- DC conducted a tour of the school/classrooms for the morning PFG group. This was well received and enjoyed.
- One parent raised the stuffiness of some of the classrooms as the windows were shut and that few water bottles were visible.

# 3. College Improvement Plan: Priorities for Year 2 – 2022-2023

- Miss Cronin explained that the College Improvement Plan is a 25-page document, detailing tasks and strategies for all areas of school life. The Priority Tasks highlight key tasks/areas for staff to focus on (from the main College Improvement Plan) during the course of the academic year, and is split into 4 main categories:

- Strategy D To enhance the quality of teaching and life-long learning.

# Evening Group -

- Positive about the Curriculum Evenings and the sharing of resources.
- One parent/carer felt that the revision strategies evening should only be run once for each year group. DC explained that this is normally the case but, due to Covid, the event was not well attended last year – hence the invitation to Year 11 parents/carers this year. Some said they found it beneficial to hear it again as you don't take everything in first time.
- A request was made for staff to share revision strategies lower down the school.
   Year 7 do not know how to revise could they start using some of the techniques in Year 7 so that they are a habit by Upper School? DC will share this point with staff.
- A parent also suggested that parents share their strategies for getting pupils to revise. Mrs Jacqueline Young was praised for her tips for supporting her daughter. DC said she would ask her to repeat this.
- Open Evening pupils enjoyed helping out. Lots of colleagues of parents/cares commented on how impressed they were with the evening and the pupils/staff.

# Evening Group - EBI

- Bus for Hailsham often late can school complain and ensure pupils are not penalised with late marks.
- Encourage pupils on Mufti Day to cover up to keep themselves safe and warm.
- Rome trip is too expensive tell parents/carers about trips first, as pupils just assume that they can go.
- Remind staff that House Points provide feedback which parents/carers need to understand if their child is working or not.
- If more children could be persuaded to go to Church on Sunday.
- Teach Year 7 Cornell Note Taking and how to do a Mind Map the St. Richard's way!
- Can the curriculum cover more life skills A national survey suggested that 60% of parents do not think that schools prepare pupils enough on things like opening a bank account etc. DC explained what St. Richard's does in PSHEe and numeracy. She also highlighted that the curriculum is packed and it is difficult to do much more.
- Keep classrooms well-ventilated.
- Encourage pupils to bring water bottles.

## 8. Teaching & Learning discussion for Wednesday evening parents/carers

- Evening Group DC emailed out book covers for each subject. The majority of parents/carers confirmed that they had not had the chance to look at them prior to the evening meeting.
- Mrs Carnell confirmed that she had reviewed the book covers and, in her opinion, the RE book wrapper was very clear and straightway you can see what topics are being covered (very useful to know for pupils and parents) and what skills hopefully they will develop – 'it's brilliant!'
- DC requested parents/carers looked at them to see how useful they were for parents and pupils. This will be added to the agenda for the next PFG meeting in November.

# 9. Any other business

- Rome trip £750 too expensive. Can this be sourced cheaper? Miss Cronin explained that School Trip companies are expensive. Parents asked if this could be done another way, to reduce costs. Miss Cronin to speak to / provide feedback to Miss Doyle. Outcome DC confirmed it cannot be changed for 2023 due to commitment already made to the travel company. However, we will be sensitive to this for the future.
- Mufti Day Great fundraiser for charities however, dressing down day will be encouraged going forward to avoid issues with inappropriate clothing choices and to avoid pupils worrying about not having 'trendy' or logo'd clothes etc.
- Year 7 Induction Mass Pupils will need to be in full uniform.
